US gridiron players' central blood pressures tested during Super Bowl Week

AtCor Medical Holdings Limited (ASX:ACG) advises that AtCor's SphygmoCor system, which measures central blood pressures non-invasively, was used to assess retired NFL players' cardiovascular risk during Super Bowl Week in the United States. These monitoring sessions, which generated print, broadcast and internet media coverage, helped to raise awareness of the importance of measuring central blood pressure using SphygmoCor.

The non-invasive SphygmoCor system is expected to change cardiovascular medical practice. Results from international studies published in 2006 have shown that measuring central blood pressure is key to understanding cardiovascular risk, and is an independent predictor of adverse cardiac events where traditional brachial or cuff blood pressure is not.
